### **PLANNED SUBJECT DESCRIPTION**

### 1. LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Share and discuss proposals and experiences with specialists in the area. The themes
  addressed contain, whenever possible, material that is different from the regular

- Improve the ability of critical and analytical observation in relation to the issues dealt with, a factor that is reflected in the writing capacity shown in the reports.

Thematic seminars (number 4), with the expert speakers from renowned national and/or international, in different areas of specialization of the Master: Public Administration, Entrepreneurship and Innovation, Logistics, and Accounting.

### 3. COHERENCE BETWEEN PROGRAMME AND OBJECTIVES

The contents of the presentations are in line with the objectives of this series of seminars in that they offer new learning perspectives and thus complement the knowledge acquired in the remaining coursework. The student learning experience is enriched on a broad socio-economic basis, which allows for an understanding of questions in this context, namely as the concerns of organizations. The themes of the conferences also encourage a better capacity for critical and analytical thinking, not only during the approach and discussion, but also during the structuring of the reports.

### 6. COHERENCE BETWEEN TEACHING METHODOLOGIES AND OBJECTIVES

Through the exhibition method it is intended that the student enriches his curriculum with a broad knowledge base and skills that allows him to understand issues in his real economic and social context. Through collaborative work tools it is intended that the student participates in an interventional and proactive way in the discussion of the topics addressed, in order to develop the capacity of critical and analytical thinking.

The PowerPoint presentations, with the possibility of interaction during the session, allows the student to intervene at any point where there is an issue not understood or there is a need for a more profound explanation, which happens frequently given that these are new learning perspectives with which the student may not be familiar. The discussion of certain aspects and the final comments both by the students and the speakers encourage the capacity for objective criticism and rational analysis related to the issues covered which is reinforced during the writing of the reports.
