PLANNED SUBJECT DESCRIPTION

1. LEARNING OBJECTIVES

This course has as primary objective to awaken students to the aesthetic sensibility, critical thinking and communication skills / perception of the object. Analysis and study of the concept of beauty by great authors to their reflection and critical application in artistic creation in the area of design and the arts in general. In the end of the course it is expected that the students:

- 1 - Master the notion of aesthetics
- 2 - Understand the evolution of the aesthetic concept through history
- 3 - Use the notion of aesthetics with criticism in design work
- 4 - Show that they can put in perspective/create/be critical in the area of design and art in general, applying theoretical concepts and aesthetic exercises

2. PROGRAMME

- 1- The aesthetic reflection - etymological sense, aesthetics over the centuries, the crisis and the problems of aesthetics and contemporary art, the judgment of taste, dematerialization of objects.
- 2- The problem of beauty - the beautiful ideal of Plato and the modern design of the modern beauty, the concept of "taste" and the judgment of taste in Kant.
- 3 -Theories of aesthetic experience - subjectivist and objectivist theories.

3. COHERENCE BETWEEN PROGRAMME AND OBJECTIVES

The notion of aesthetics and the study/critical power will eventually give meaning to the liberation of the subject by the object created. Currently, in the design exercise, crossing interdisciplinary knowledge where philosophy and aesthetic definitions of "taste" and beauty among others, allows an individual and conceptual exploration of the object where the freedom of the individual reaches the top.
